



Roblox warning



Roblox is a popular online game-creating system where children **create** and **publish** games, and **play** other users' games. It is relatively easy for children to see content that **isn't age-appropriate.**

Strangers can contact children – there have been recent news articles about grooming via Roblox

Children can easily **lose** a large amount of real-world **money**. Be **aware** of conversations about Roblox, and **remind** your children to be careful when talking to strangers online.

Online sites such as YouTube use **algorithms** (computer programming) to recommend videos to watch based on viewing habits. Research has shown that these algorithms can push users towards increasingly extreme content on sites such as Reddit, Instagram, TikTok, Discord and Twitch.

Be **mindful** of what your children are doing online and encourage **critical thinking** when faced with targeted adverts and algorithms.
