Health & safeguarding warning from the London Borough of Newham

Some children are being sold vapes containing spice advertised as tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) vapes. Vaping among children has been on the rise recently and the introduction of additional ingredients and substances can pose serious health risks. The chemicals found in many vape products can have detrimental effects on the developing bodies and minds of children.

We wanted to ensure that you are aware of the risks associated with vaping, which include respiratory problems, addiction and potential long term health issues. It is important to us, as parents and educators, to work together to address this issue and educate our children about the dangers of vaping.

I encourage you to have an open conversation with your child about the risks and consequences of vaping. It is essential to create a supportive environment where they feel comfortable discussing their choices and concerns.

Another busy day of art in EYFS using the Curiosity Approach

The approach is further explained by Miss Yeter below: 'The Curiosity Approach is driven by active learning and critical thinking through the use of adults and an enabling environment. The environment is an extension of children's homes — objects that are familiar to the children. We use neutral colours within the provision to provide a calm yet stimulating environment. Children are the centre of their own development and are encouraged to explore, experiment and create using authentic and natural resources modelled by staff. The use of authentic and natural resources promotes independence and teaches the children about cause and effect. Children have a view/input into their environment and staff plan learning opportunities that follow the child's agenda and extend children's ideas to enrich play experiences.




