From 2nd - 6th June 2025, pupils from St Luke's Primary School took part in World of Work (WoW) and benefitted from a week of career-focused learning including interactive activities, projects and experiments in the classroom, alongside volunteer sessions in school, all organised by Inspire and funded by Excel London.
