WHAT IS DANCE WRITE?

Dance write is an activity carried out with music and books. It provides opportunities for movement so that children develop their fine and gross motor skills.

It helps support children's balance and coordination for writing.



At St-Luke's, we carry out two forms of dance write. A practitioner reads a story or sings a song, and pauses each time to make marks that may link to the story/song. The children use two crayons (one in each hand) and a large roll of paper to make their marks.

The second form is through dancing with scarves. We imitate the movements of different lines that will help us form letters.







DOUGH DISCO?




Dough Disco is an activity in which children use play dough to carry out a range of hand and fingers exercises. It helps develop their fine and gross motor skills.





WHAT ARE FINE MOTOR ACTIVITIES?

Fine motor activities involve the use of small muscles of the hand. They include activities like using scissors, zipping, drawing and eating. It is crucial to create opportunities to develop their fine motor skills to support with every day tasks.







WHAT ARE GROSS MOTOR ACTIVITIES?

Gross motor
activities involve the
use of larger muscles
and usually require
whole body
movements. We carry
out activities like
dance, ball games,
large construction
and climbing.

WHAT IS

PHONICS?

The phonics scheme we use is called Letters and Sounds.

Letters and Sounds



The phonics scheme we use helps prepare children to learn how to read and write. It is taught in a systematic way. In nursery we integrate phase 1 phonics into everything we do. We teach phase 2 phonics (which exposes children to the sounds of letters) once children are settled. We aim to teach 1 sound every 2-3 weeks.
