Dear Parents and Carers,

*On Friday 27th January, five of our children represented St. Luke's at Newham's Holocaust Memorial Ceremony, this is one of the most important events that we attend and the school has been honoured to have been invited to the last three commemorations.*

It is a very sombre event and this year Michael Bibring talked about his late father Harry, who arrived in this country from Vienna as one of the first 'Kindertransport'\* children in 1938. The children read out a poem they had composed (below):

Numbers Replace Names  
The gruesome gates of death,  
Beckon the unfortunate ones into the  
camp.  
Barbed wire grabs and snatches,  
Skin is pierced and torn.  
Machine guns stare into Jewish souls.  
Tattoos poison the skin.  
Numbers replace names.  
Chimneys reach high,  
Spewing out suffocating smoke.  
Broken bodies, broken hearts,  
Forced to wear Jewish stars,  
That cling to arms,  
As they look for hope in times of darkness  
and despair.

(\*The Kindertransport, German for 'children's transport') was an organised rescue effort of children (but not their parents) from Nazi-controlled territory that took place during the nine months prior to the outbreak of the Second World War. The United Kingdom took in nearly 10,000 predominantly Jewish children from Germany, Austria, Czechoslovakia, Poland, and the Free City of Danzig. Often they were the only members of their families who survived the Holocaust. The programme was supported, publicised, and encouraged by the British government. Importantly the British government waived the visa immigration requirements that were not within

the ability of the British Jewish community to fulfil. The British government put no number limit on the programme

## Murder most Foul - Solving a Mystery


