In the end it was a great day for all and especially for our Y6s who are taking their SATs tests next Tuesday-Friday. Below is an excerpt from a letter we sent them this week to help them get into the right place to produce their best:

'The SATs tests measure only a few things about you – your grammar and spelling, answering questions on small sections of information (reading) and mathematical skills. They don't measure all the things that make you a unique gift to this world and they don't 'describe' you as your families and teachers know you.

They do not measure some of you who have the ability to use and understand more than one language and culture. They do not measure that some of you are fantastic, musicians, artists and sports people. They do not measure the goodness in you and the fact that you demonstrate such care for your friends and family. They do not measure that some of you are carers for others in your family or that even at such a young age you are helping your family to cope in such difficult times.

It is your families and the school that know this and will never forget this and this is why we have such pride and belief in you. Do not get stressed next week – the hard work is done.'
