Yesterday our children took part in our annual Remembrance assembly to commemorate all those affected by the wars of the last 100 years. It was a very moving assembly organised by Mr. Durrant and we were honoured to have Mary Edwards, a school friend and neighbour attending, whose husband Albert had served his country in World War 2 before sadly passing away last year. The children learnt of the origins of the poppy we wear today to commemorate all those who have lost their lives in conflict. Afterwards, a small group of Y6

pupils laid a wreath at the memorial at St. Luke's community centre. The children's conduct was exemplary all the way through.

Talking of exemplary conduct, I was privileged to accompany the Year 4 trip to the Natural History Museum on Monday. The lead teacher from another school commented at the museum on how polite and respectful our children were and it made me think, even when 'we' have a bad day it shouldn't distract from the fact that our children are usually exceptionally well behaved and you, like us, can be very proud of them.

On the first day of the Christmas holidays, 21<sup>st</sup> December, some of the staff of the school, the Church and the homeless charity *Street Kitchen* are aiming to serve free Christmas dinners to 100 homeless people from the area. We want to give these people some practical help as well and are asking for any donations of old winter coats, sleeping bags, underwear and personal hygiene products (particularly ladies) that you may have spare. Mrs Simpson had the original idea for this act of charity and if you as a parent want to help, please let her know.

We have a request for empty plastic milk bottles for a Christmas project being organised by Ms Koenig (Y4) - Washed and clean please!

The flu is an illness caused by the influenza virus and is common during the winter months. The vaccination programme is designed to protect your child against flu, which can be an unpleasant illness. The immunisation team will be at our school on  $7^{th}$  December 2017 helping to protect them from the flu virus in time for the winter and helping to protect other family members because they are not spreading the influenza virus.
