Dear Parents and friends,


A big welcome back (and a Happy New Year!) to all our families after the Christmas break. We pray that you had a restful holiday, even if it now seems such a long time ago!

The homeless event we hosted on 21<sup>st</sup> December grew from an idea from Shera Collins our Office Manager who wanted to collect blankets for the homeless – this quickly morphed into a desire to host an event whereby we could feed some homeless people as well as give them some clothing and other essentials to take away. We had a massive amount of donations from friends and family of the school, the church, other Newham primary schools, Waitrose, Juniper Catering Services and others.
