Dear Parents,

Welcome back to you all - it has been so nice to see everybody again this week. The children have been fantastic. Whilst many staff have been in at different times during the holidays to get ready for this academic year, it needs the children and parents to come back to make it all worthwhile!

The holidays are a great time to recharge ourselves, but for some they can be very challenging, especially if you have to work and keep

your children active. I have appreciated this even more this year, as my mother passed away a few weeks ago and the funeral was this week. Through all the pain however, I have found it a very faith-affirming experience and, in the way of life, it was counter balanced by a member of staff becoming a grandmother on the same day my mother died. Through all we do in school we encourage the children to reflect on and at times lean upon their faith and that has certainly worked for me.

Growth Mindset or The Art of 'I can't do it ... yet!'

In our welcome assembly on Wednesday, we introduced the children to the power of 'Growth Mindset' and how we need to exercise our most important muscle – the brain!. We explained how many successful people – whether Einsteins, Bolts or Ronaldos – only became who they were by making mistakes, learning from them and refusing to give up! You as parents are your child's biggest role models. If they have a task to do and get it wrong, instead of scolding them, try to encourage them to try again. Show them that we are all on a journey of learning and we all make mistakes – but only those with 'Growth Mindset' and who are willing to embrace those mistakes, improve their knowledge and skillset.
