Homeless meal and gifts for the elderly

Last Tuesday, 37 pupils of our school choir went to raise money by singing carols at *Waitrose* supermarket, Canary Wharf, and raised a whopping £820 for our homeless event. This was a truly astonishing effort from our children and no sooner had they arrived back than I had an email from a Canary Wharf office worker eulogising their behaviour and singing. And the singing didn't stop there as yesterday morning our singers entertained the elderly residents at 55 Ruscoe Road who we have also invited to our Christmas Nativity shows next week. In last week's newsletter I mentioned that we would like to make up some shoe boxes with small gifts inside to give to them as a Christmas present - many of them do not have family to visit them or make them feel special at Christmas time. When we have done this in the past, a mix of toiletries (tube of toothpaste, scented soap) and some small bits to eat (chocolate bar, packet of humbug sweets) really makes the elderly folk feel appreciated. If everyone was able to donate one item then we could make up presents for them.

Early Years Christmas Craft Fair

I'd like to say a massive thank-you to the staff and parents in Early Years who took part in the craft fair on Wednesday. We had about 60% of our families represented and although it was very messy it was enormous fun - you cannot underestimate how beneficial it was to the children.
