This week has been about us making links with schools around us and using these opportunities to help us grow...

Some of our staff attended a moderation event at Star Primary on Wednesday aimed at helping staff compare where our children's writing is compared to other schools and national standards. Next week we will be welcoming staff from a school in Tower Hamlets who are looking to improve their children's writing and would like to see how we teach writing through a topic based curriculum. Next week also sees a team from 'Creative Schools' coming to help us plan a special innovation week for the Summer term where we intend to solve some of the world's big problems with help from real engineers! March will see us working closely with other Newham schools as well as a lengthy piece of collaboration with a Church of England school in Barking and Dagenham whereby they will help us with our Maths development and we will assist them with RE and Reading. These exchanges of ideas and best practice help us to develop as a school and increase the excitement for learning in our children.

Parent Workshop

Your support for the parent workshops we have been running this half term has been fantastic.

After a string of school-related workshops (phonics for EY and KS1, music for SEND,



reading training for Y5&6 parents), this morning saw us looking at health topics and **thirty** parents attended a fun quiz aimed at helping us all realise the dangers

of too much sugar and salt in our food as well as recognising what a healthy portion size might look like for our children. The session was run by Grainne Sheehy who works as a catering development officer for NPW. This was the first time she has hosted such a session and we intend to build on this by hosting another session specifically on healthy alternatives to sugar and salt laden food in the summer term.

Inspiration this week

The Y4's had a visit from 'Thorgill the Viking' this week to help them immerse themselves in Norse culture and the Viking Sagas in particular.



Inspiration next week

Next week we have Steve Kersys from the Diocese of Chelmsford coming to work with some of the children on supporting their spirituality and also supporting wellbeing and self image from a Christian perspective. The children will make their own triptych and we will include an example of this artwork in next week's newsletter.

Our Y5/6 boys and girls football teams went to Chobham this week to play a game and do some joint training. Our boys won 3-1 despite not playing as well as they usually can and the girls took part in a joint training session to help them prepare for their West Ham tournament today which sees them trying to qualify for a regional final at a Premier league ground. On Tuesday, some of our SEND children took part in an adapted sports tournament and it has made us want to deliver a SEND sports day for 5 or 6 schools at St Luke's in the Summer, so these children can have the thrill of taking part in competitive sports.
