Dear Parents

Monday saw five of our Y6 students accompanied by myself attend the Newham Holocaust Memorial service at the Old Town Hall in Stratford. Alongside some readings from schools there were incredibly moving eye-witness testimonies from John Hajdu, a Hungarian Jewish survivor from the Holocaust, Arnesa Buljusmic-Kustura, a Muslim survivor of the attempted genocide in Bosnia 25 years ago, and Lady Hannah Lowy Mitchell who was born in this country but whose family from Czechoslovakia (as it was known then) were decimated in the concentration camps of Eastern Europe.

It was difficult to listen to their testimonies without feeling a sense of shame and shock that the world had allowed these atrocities to happen. The lasting message of the service was that to prevent this from ever happening again we must always stand together against racism and fascism whenever we encounter it, a message we continually share with our pupils.

Walk Like Egyptians - the Y3 way!

Thanks to the Y3 class and Miss Peters for showing us what they have learnt about Ancient Egypt in Wednesday's assembly. They also managed to 'light a fire' in our children about the Equator which inspired other classes to find out new information.

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM LONDON BOROUGH OF NEWHAM ADMISSIONS!

Free school meals in primary schools = extra funding for your child's school

Every primary school aged child attending school in Newham still has the opportunity to have a free school lunch even if their parents/carers are not in receipt of one of the qualifying benefits for free school meals. Whether your child is at primary school and receiving a free meal, has lunch at home or you are currently working, we request that the parents/carers of all primary and secondary aged children in Newham should still register for free school meals, even if you don't think you are currently eligible.

Once we have the application if at anytime a family is in receipt of one of the qualifying benefits for free school meals we will automatically update our records and their school will receive additional funding known as Ever6 Pupil Premium. This is up to £1,320 depending on the child's age.

It is important that you check eligibility on 'London Borough of Newham' website & apply for 'Free School Meals' before your child starts Secondary School. Average cost per year in Secondary is £437!
