# Dear Parents & Carers

# When you are lucky enough to be a parent there are so many stages in the journey that sometimes you can forget where you are trying to get to!

As a parent bringing up children, life is often tough and seems to go slowly as you guide them through life: their first time walking, their first words, their first day in school, etc, and then they get to 18 and you think 'my word, how did that happen so fast!' #### **Our New Normal**

We had another glimpse of the new 'normal' this week as we had some health concerns for some children in the Year 3 & 4 Phase/Bubble. It took a few days but all of the tests have now come back negative which is great news - and to be clear, we do not close a bubble because someone has gone for a test (because over 98% of tests come back negative), we close a bubble as soon as we have a positive test reported. If we had to close, for example the EY Phase/Bubble, then we would also send home any brothers or sisters of those children in other Phases. So far 24 Bubbles in 17 schools have been sent home so I fully expect it will happen at some stage here but I know we will deal with it sensibly. On that point I would like to thank all parents for not hanging around the school gates after drop off in the morning but we can all improve our Social Distancing before drop off

#### Maths, No Problem (MNP)

To support your child's learning, we're giving you an online version of your child's maths textbook and workbook from the maths scheme we follow called *MNP Parent Guides*. Once you're signed in, you'll be able to access maths content for your child's year group, along with help guides and lesson support.
