Dear Parents and Carers,

I want to begin this week by thanking all parents for responding so positively to my request for you to wear masks at pick-up and drop-off. It is a change in response to the escalating situation and one that helps us to stay as safe as possible.

The way that the staff and families have worked together has once again filled me with pride and is the reason we have not had to send any children home at any stage since we entered this strange world in March this year – you have all been magnificent. We have to remain focused on the details of spacing and wearing of masks in order to keep the children in school learning and laughing with each other. I strongly believe this is the best thing we can do for their mental health – just being as normal as possible. I think as adults we understand that what is stressing us is the absence of normality so the fact that the children can come in and still have the amazing experiences that are detailed below is a light in the current darkness.

Year 2 virtual visit with the National Army Museum

In readiness for next week's Remembrance Services, which will see our children once again lay a wreath at the memorial in St. Luke's Church, our Y2 children took part in a virtual session around the history and symbolism of the Poppy to us.
