Dear Parents & Carers

Thanks to all the parents of keyworker children who educated their children at home on Friday and allowed the staff to do a morning of preparation for the re-opening of the whole school next week – it was massively appreciated and allowed us not only go through all our procedures again but also to have some input on the psychological factors that we need to watch out for as a result of this latest lockdown.



Next week sees our whole school family reunited for the first time since early December, 3 months ago! Below is the timetable for next week so please look at it carefully. *To summarise:* **YR,Y2,Y4, Y5 & Y6 are back on Monday, YN,Y1&Y3 come back on Tuesday.**

By staggering it this way we can train up the older children in each phase/bubble and then concentrate on the younger ones the following day. This should ensure we have our hygiene routines in place as soon as possible and so minimise the chances of having to send any phase/bubble home because of virus contact.

Return to school:

Monday 8th March 2021

YR, Y2, Y4, Y5 & Y6 are back full time from this day

Y5 & Y6

Children are asked to come in via the back gate in Tarling Road at **8.30am** and they will be sent home at **3.10pm** from the same gate If you collect your child you can come into KS2 playground from 3pm, where a member of SLT

will show you where to wait – lunch is as normal – they are NOT to bring a school bag or PE kit in until we notify you to do so but can bring in a named water bottle this is so we minimise the risk of germs moving between home and school.

Children are asked to come in via the back gate in Tarling Road at **8.40am** and they will be sent home at **3.20pm** from the same gate—if you collect your child you can come into KS2 playground from 3pm, SLT will show you where to wait — lunch is as normal — they are NOT to bring a school bag or PE kit in until asked to do so by their teacher but can bring in a named water bottle

Children are asked to come in via the main gate in Ruscoe Road at **8.40am**– Y2 parents come into the area next to the bike shelter and say goodbye.

They will be sent home at **3.15pm** from the same gate, parents are to wait for their child in the area where the bike shed is – lunch is as normal – they are NOT to bring a school bag or PE kit in until asked to do so by their teacher but can bring in a named water bottle

Children are asked to come in via the Nursery gate at **8.40am** and they will be sent home at **3.20pm** from the same gate – lunch is as normal – they are NOT to bring a school bag or PE kit in until asked to do so by their teacher but can bring in a named water bottle

YN, Y1 & Y3 are asked to stay at home for this day only as we train the older children in the phase first

Tuesday 9th March 2021 YN, Y1, Y3, are back full time from this day

- YN children are asked to come in via the Nursery gate at 9am and they will be sent home at 3pm from the same gate lunch is as normal they are NOT to bring a school bag or PE kit in until asked to do so by their teacher but can bring in a named water bottle
- Y1 children are asked to come in via the main gate in Ruscoe Road at 8.40am Y1 parents can come into the area next to the bike shelter and say goodbye. They will be sent home at 3.15pm from the same gate, parents are to wait for their child in the area where the bike shed is lunch is as normal they are NOT to bring a school bag or PE kit in until asked to do so by their teacher but can bring in a named water bottle
- Y3 children are asked to come in via the back gate in Tarling Road at 8.40am and they will be sent home at 3.20pm from the same gate—if you collect your child you can come into KS2 playground from 3pm and a member of SLT will show you where to wait lunch is as normal they are NOT to bring a school bag or PE kit in until asked to do so by their teacher but can bring in a named water bottle

General Information:

PARENTS – Please allow yourself additional time and remember to socially distance as you drop-off – you may need to wait a few extra seconds as family in front of you says goodbye – You have been fantastic so far I know you will set the right example

If your child has a temperature of 37.8c or above, a continuous cough or a loss of taste or smell and above your child will be sent home immediately – I am sure you understand why we are taking this precaution. We understand that many of you may still be working from home,

however in the unlikely event you are rung to take your child home because of a suspected case of Co-vid 19, you will need to pick them up as fast as you possibly can as this will have become a Public Health issue and you yourself and the rest of your family unit will have to self-isolate.

Great news from a former pupil of ours, Toluwa Oriakhi, who left in July 2019.
