Dear Parents & Carers

It has been so good to see virtually all our children and families back this week and the school has rapidly got back to a more normal feeling.

This will further speed up next week when we re-open before and after-school clubs to those who asked for places this week. I am grateful for your patience with this but due to Covid restrictions for Phases/Bubbles and the need for a much deeper clean every day it is far more complicated than a year ago!



The children have settled back well and have been talking - *a lot!* But that's good. Lockdown and a lot of online lessons has meant that their spoken skills need to be given as much practise as possible. They have also been given lots of time to be physical in their learning and play, something else that has been difficult for them in lockdown. I hope they get plenty of rest this weekend as they can expect another busy week of learning and fun next week.

Safeguarding - IMPORTANT!

With the return to school based learning there will be a decrease in children needing to use laptops for work. Thanks to the 45 families we were able to support with laptops for returning them all in one piece.

But it became apparent as we checked the search histories that a couple of devices had been misused with searches for inappropriate content found. This is often done by older family members however this leads to an investigation and the involvement of social services so when we loan devices we must be clear they are for class work only – we will not be able to support families again if we think that a lack of supervision will endanger a young child.

We were due to hold a meeting next Tuesday regarding the specific part of the new RSHE curriculum but with the current pressures of re-opening school alongside re-establishing before and after-school clubs we have decided to move this meeting to **5pm on Monday the 19th April**. 
Schooling – new parent/school communication system
