Dear Parents,

We are due to take the next step out of lockdown on Monday and then finally leave all restrictions in mid-June however we are starting to see more and more children suffering from the long-term effects of what we have been through.

Adults and children have felt the physical effects of working through this period but it is the hidden mental pressures that are particularly

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worrying. So if you are noticing changes in your child's behaviour and are worried, please speak to your class teacher, myself or Miss Norcross as the earlier we work together to sort any problems the better it will be for the children. An example of one of the things we do is to use our outdoor area to do jobs that are less pressured than sit-down lessons, such as Mr. Scott's building work (see towards the end of the newsletter). Activities such as these allow the children to learn to interact with one another again, learn new skills, feel good about themselves and of course, be out in the fresh air.


refreshed and ready to learn. Please try and join in next week and beyond - it's good for you and our world.


It's official – Ducks are best!

On the 9th April this year **the La Soufrière volcano** on the island of St. Vincent in the West Indies erupted for the first time since 1979 causing massive damage. One of Newham's schools, Maryland Primary have launched an appeal to help the children and families of the island. **They are a school that has actively supported our homeless appeals in the past**. They have organised a shipping crate to send with the idea of filling it up with donations. They plan to send spare school equipment but if any parents wish to make
