Dear Parents.

A message from our new Bishop, The Right Reverend Dr Guli Francis-Dehgani

Bishop Guli said in a recent sermon: "...if we put our trust in God, we are used both for our strengths and our weaknesses, but that often it is through our vulnerabilities that we make the deepest connections and have the greatest impact. That at any rate has often been my experience." Rather than creating a stronghold, perhaps opening up and building relationships is more likely to be the kind of leadership that enriches others and will have the greatest impact on the children. After all, in many Psalms the expression of frustration, even anger, ends with such a refrain and promise as Psalm 31.24: "Be strong and take heart, all you who hope in the Lord."

Bishop Guli's words are very pertinent at the moment. I think this is a time of fragility and vulnerability for many of us – children, families and staff and it is how we support each other through these tough times, that marks out the kind of community we are. It is so important to listen to each other and understand that for some of us, life at the moment can feel overwhelming at times. It is at that point that we as a community need to put an 'arm' around each other and let each other know that it is okay to feel vulnerable and that with the strength of others we can regain our confidence and our children can regain the future they deserve.


Thank-You!


