# Ben Kinsella Trust

"On Monday morning, the Year 6 children went to Islington Library where they had a workshop on a knife crime story. Ben Kinsella, the victim of this murder, has a very important legacy and was one of the 15 young adults stabbed to death in 2008. The Ben Kinsella Story tells young people why not to carry a knife and the people you should trust. The first part was telling us about Ben as a younger child and the fun things he liked to do. Then there was a film with cctv footage of when Ben Kinsella

got murdered and his family's reaction to the stabbing. The video was very emotional and heartbreaking.



The third exhibition had a room with different consequences that holding a knife will have on you if it is not used for the proper uses like holding a knife for illegal reasons can get you four years in prison and using or encouraging it can get you twenty five years in prison. The fourth room was a prison cell with someone who had been put in prison for encouraging her boyfriend to scare their neighbour who had been talking behind their back saying bad stuff. Then she told us all the amazing chances she missed out on because she went to prison, like her sister's graduation, her birthday and spending time with her family. The final room had a comic strip on the wall telling us about another story about a knife crime telling us different scenarios." – Jalil Y6
