Dear Parents and Carers,

Due to our Eco links with Green Flag Award Scheme and Keep Britain Tidy, St. Luke's was contacted by the DFE to host a visit from the Permanent Secretary at the DfE (Department for Education) Susan Acland Hood. The aim of the visit was to look at the work our children have been doing around environmental sustainability, and also wider work involving our Justice Committee and the Young Carers Project that we hosted in the Summer Term.

Ms Acland-Hood and one of her staff visited this Friday, 4th November, and met with children representing these groups and learnt about our special day of learning we had on 3rd November to mark *Global Action Day* (COP 27) and the *Running Out of Time* agenda. They also talked with the Justice Committee about their journey with *Education for Change* (E4C) aimed at developing a curriculum that is more reflective of our local community and challenges it faces. Then it was the turn of our Young Carers to meet her so she could find out about the stresses and strains the children live with every day as carers for other family members and the importance of them allowing









#### Check you've received all the government's cost of living payments

The government's <u>cost of living payment</u> is available for those receiving certain benefits or tax credits. You don't need to apply for these – if you're eligible the money should go straight into your account.

If you think you're due a payment, but haven't received one – report a missing payment to the government here.

Be aware of scams! If you receive any emails, texts or phone calls asking you to fill in an application form or asking for your bank details to receive a cost of living payment, do not talk to them or send a reply. #### Find out what help you can get with your energy bills

Take a look at these resources from <u>Simple Energy Advice</u>, the <u>British Gas Energy Trust</u> and the <u>Money Saving Expert</u> website.

Let us know if your child is entitled to free school meals (FSM)

If your child is eligible for free school meals (FSM) you need to get them registered. This will allow them to get a free meal at school, and we'll get extra funding to support your child's learning. Ask at the school office for help on checking to see if your child qualifies.

#### See what other support you can get from your local authority

Local authorities have lots of different schemes that you might be eligible for, including:

- The holiday activities and food programme access to food and activities over the school holidays
- > Help with transport to school
- Help with the cost of uniform

#### Get free or low-cost food

If you're worried about not having enough food to feed your family, you're not alone. There are a number of places offering support.

- The school runs a breakfast club for YR-Y6 that is free to parents if your child qualifies for Pupil Premium Grant .
- If you have a child under 4, and meet the eligibility criteria, you may be entitled to <u>healthy</u> <u>start food vouchers</u>
- Find a local foodbank with these websites: <u>Bankuet</u>, <u>The Independent Food Aid Network</u>, the <u>Trussell Trust</u>, or your local <u>community fridge</u> or go to the:

Use food waste apps and websites like <u>Olio</u> (for free food and household items from your local community), <u>too Good To Go</u> (for low cost food from local restaurants), or <u>Low Price</u> <u>Foods</u> (food that has passed its best before date, but is still safe to consume)
